At our last General Meeting we ended up with a Q&A because the scheduled presenter was no longer available. At one point, we touched briefly on the upcoming version of IE8. As I have been beta testing IE8 I was able to add a few salient points with regard to what it will entail. There will be some very good additions as I have previously noted. When it is completed, this will be a well advised upgrade. However, at this point, IE8 is not ready for prime time. Once in awhile, I experience problems. Nothing I would call major in the way of faults. More like minor irritants. And, as if the IE8 developers were reading minds, the next day there was an update available. So far, I have not noted any discernable difference in performance from the update. If I have one complaint, it is that IE8 seems to hog an awful lot of the processor availability.

How would I know that IE8 is using a great deal of processor power? Because I can readily see what my processor is doing by using Process Explorer. I mentioned this Utility that is freely available from Microsoft in previous articles. It beats Task Manager hands down. I have used Process Explorer as well as the recently released Desktops Utility extensively.

I hope that all of you are aware of the latest bugs and code flaws that have recently been announced. If you have checked the BOLO page on the website, I have listed the latest and most prevalent problems. The biggie was one the involved Microsoft and IE7. I followed up the BOLO with a listing in my "Stuff is Happening section of the "Forum". I hope this was helpful. An out of band update was issued by Microsoft. If you did not get it or did not allow it to install, please do so at the first opportunity.

At our last Tuesday morning FUNSIG in December, several attendees mentioned that they had not installed the SP3 for Windows XP. This should be rectified by any that have yet to do so. And, speaking of service packs, there will be one for Vista. Just when SP2 will be released has not yet been determined.

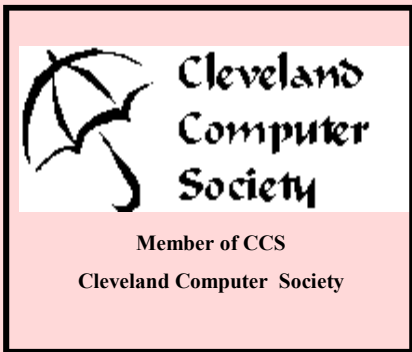
